Abstract:

Now days, accident due to driving plays an important role in individual and social

damages. There are few families which have not ever experienced such accidents and

damages. Undoutably, the worst damages are related to people death and disabilities that.

In addition to its effects on families it cause some irreparable damages for society. There

fore, it seems essential to make a new decision and policy in order to increase the drivers,

passengers and vehicles security and decrease damages.

One of the solution to do so, is using seatbelts and according to the survey in different

injuries in accidents about 40% is head injuries, 30% injuries in upper body, 15% arms

and hands injuries and 15% injuries happen to legs.

Consequently using seatbelt can decrease cerebro spinal and internal organs damages up to

70% there are some statistics about using seatbelt. In Europe and USA as follows:

1. in the year 2004 most of death happened to the ages under 44 because of cerebro spinal

injuries.

2. Annually 35 thousands people were dead in driving accidents while about 17000 people

(50%) who used the seatbelt were survived.

3. using seatbelt accurately and correctly can decrease the injuries up to 50% and reduce

the death toll up to 60% to 70% this assay was written to introduce a general and practical
